Grade 2 Opinion

W.2.1 Write opinion pieces in which they introduce the topic or book they are writing about, state an opinion, supply reasons that support the opinion, use linking words (e.g., because, and, also,) to connect opinion and reasons, and provide a concluding statement or section.

The Reading/Thinking/Writing Task

Students were immersed in a multi-week biography unit reading about famous people from different disciplines. The students listened to texts read aloud, read other texts independently during reading groups, and then worked with the Focusing Question “*Who do you think is the most important person we have read about?*”

This question requires that students evaluate the list of famous scientists, activists, authors, artists, and more, and choose the one they believe is the most important, the one who contributed the most to society, and then to support their choice with evidence from the text and other various resources provided and shared.

Note: Some of the pieces in this set did not originally have titles. Each was given a basic title for ease of reference.

Focus of the Writing Task

Who do you think is the most important person we have read about?

The Writing Task in the Curriculum

How is it embedded in curriculum/content?

★ *Class: 2nd grade ELA curriculum*

★ *Curriculum unit*

- students studied a variety of famous men and women from around the world and evaluated which one they thought made the biggest impact on the lives of others
- emphasis on evaluating and providing evidence to support their opinion

★ *Standards*

- Reading: RI.2.1, RI.2.5, RI.2.6, RI.2.10
- Writing: W.2.1, W.2.8, W.2.10

How did students build the knowledge they needed?

★ *Texts*

- a variety of biographies were read aloud and read instructionally as part of reading groups
- charts of famous people with notes about their accomplishments

★ *Reading and re-reading*

- teacher read texts aloud
- students read and re-read texts independently and instructionally
- students took notes on texts using common graphic organizers

What instructional approaches were used to teach writing?

★ *Craft lessons*

- students were just beginning to be introduced to basic expository structures (Painted Essay® in many forms and more) including such elements as introductions, grouping related information together, linking words, and conclusions

★ *Writing approaches*

- students were reminded of the elements that make up a strong essay in the directions. They then wrote and proofread independently.

What was the timeframe?

Long (3-4 weeks)

Final Thoughts
(Gr 2 Opinion: Proficient)

Overall, this second grade essay shows solid understanding of the topic. The opinion, that Louis Pasteur was the most important person this writer read about in class, is well-supported with one reason well-elaborated. The writer states their opinion and supports it with two reasons (*he created a vaccine for rabies and he made milk safe to drink*). This second grade writer shows an understanding of the process of pasteurization and describes it in the piece using precise academic vocabulary acquired from the classroom's reading experiences during the unit. The concluding statement relates to the opinion presented.

Control of Conventions: Although there are some errors, the writer shows *overall control* over grade-level language and conventions.

Final Thoughts
(Gr 2 Opinion: Approaching)

Overall, this second grade opinion piece shows some understanding of the topic. The writer gives one reason why Rachel Carson is famous but the reason lacks elaboration to help the reader understand more about how Carson stopped the use of DDT and it's impact on animals and plants. The concluding sentence relates to the opinion presented.

This student could benefit from support in revising the piece to include more evidence and reasons that support the opinion.

Minimal Control of Conventions: The writer shows little control over language and conventions.

(Gr 2 Opinion: Beginning)

Overall, this essay shows basic understanding of the topic. The writer shows confusion about how to structure basic sentences to show their understanding of the topic.

Even though students were given a worksheet to record their notes, this writer would benefit from practice with orally rehearsing the notes/evidence on his graphic organizer prior to writing.

A Word About Language and Conventions
(Gr 2 Opinion: Beginning)

Minimal Control of Conventions: The writer shows little control over language and conventions. The lack of control of conventions and language interferes with the reader's understanding of the piece.

Final Thoughts
(Gr 2 Opinion: Exceeds)

Overall, this second grade opinion piece exceeds the standard for proficient. It meets all the criteria for proficient, and shows a solid understanding of the life of Cesar Chavez, a difficult topic for a young student. The writer consistently sticks to the focus, supplying multiple pieces of evidence from a variety of sources.

In addition, the piece contains in-depth evidence to develop the focus. Within that evidence, the writer uses complex and compound sentences, precise and sophisticated language and domain-specific vocabulary.

Control of Conventions: Although there are some errors, the writer shows *overall control* over grade-level language and conventions.
