Grade 2 Opinion

W.2.1 Write opinion pieces in which they introduce the topic or book they are writing about, state an opinion, supply reasons that support the opinion, use linking words (e.g., because, and, also,) to connect opinion and reasons, and provide a concluding statement or section.

The Reading/Thinking/Writing Task

Students were immersed in a multi-week science and literature unit investigating whether or not people should interfere with nature using *Meeri Meets the Osprey* as their anchor text. The students listened to the text read aloud, then learned about ospreys from videos and other sources. As a class, they took public notes on the pros and cons of helping the ospreys, engaged in guided debates, discussed activism, then worked with the Focusing Question "*Should Meeri help the ospreys find a good home*?"

This question requires that students weigh the evidence before developing an opinion supported by reasons and accurate evidence from the text.

Note: Some of the pieces in this set did not originally have titles. Each was given a basic title for ease of reference.

Focus of the Writing Task

Should Meeri help the ospreys find a good home?

The Writing Task in the Curriculum

How is it embedded in curriculum/content?

- *☆* Class: 2nd grade ELA and Science curriculum
- Curriculum unit
 - Students read *Meeri Meets the Ospreys* as a class and explored the text through the lens of whether to help or not help animals that are going extinct in the wild
 - emphasis on weighing on both sides before developing an opinion and supporting that opinion with evidence and reasons
- - Reading: RI.2.1, RI.2.6, RI.2.10
 - Writing: W.2.1, W.2.8

How did students build the knowledge they needed?

- *★* Texts
 - Students listened to the text *Meeri Meets the Ospreys*
 - Public notes became a resource for the students as they wrote
- Reading and re-reading
 - teacher read the text aloud multiple times
 - students discussed the text and ideas in the text in guided conversations, and had fish-bowl debates
 - as a class, students gathered specific evidence supporting both sides of the argument in group notes

What instructional approaches were used to teach writing?

- Craft lessons
 - students were just beginning to be introduced to basic expository structures (Painted Essay® in many forms and more) including elements such as introductions, grouping related information together, linking words, and conclusions
- Writing approaches
 - students were reminded of the elements that make up a strong essay in the directions. They then wrote and proofread independently.

What was the timeframe?

Long (3 weeks)

Introduces the topic with needed context and the **opinion** is clearly **stated**

Supplies reasons that support the opinion that Meeri should help the ospreys

Uses appropriate linking words to connect opinion and reasons

Provides a concluding statement related to the opinion stated

Final Thoughts (Gr 2 Opinion: Proficient)

Overall, this second grade essay shows solid understanding of the topic. The writer offers needed context, explaining that in the book, Meeri tries to find a home for the ospreys. The opinion (that Meeri should help the ospreys) is clearly stated and well supported with reasons and examples. Linking words and phrases (for example, also, another reason) connect the ideas and information in the piece. This second grade writer shows a clear understanding of the issue and describes it using precise academic vocabulary and accurate information acquired from the text and the classroom experiences during the unit. The concluding statement relates to the opinion presented.

Introduces the topic, and the **opinion** is clearly **stated**

Supplies reasons that support the opinion

Uses some linking words to connect opinion and reason

The piece ends abruptly, lacking a concluding statement.

Final Thoughts (Gr 2 Opinion: Approaching)

Overall, this second grade opinion piece shows some understanding of the topic. The writer introduces the topic and clearly states an opinion. The piece offers two reasons why Meeri should help the osprey (people don't want ospreys to die and people need to help nature) that come from the text and the information gathered in class. However, the reasons are minimally supported and lack elaboration and the piece lacks a sense of closure.

This writer could benefit from oral discussion with the teacher about the osprey issue before writing the piece to improve elaboration. This student could also benefit from support in revising the piece to include a conclusion that follows from the opinion.

Uses basic vocabulary

Uses a linking word to connect opinion and reasons

Provides a concluding statement

Final Thoughts (Gr 2 Opinion: Beginning)

Overall, this essay shows basic understanding of the topic and some understanding of the structure of an essay. The piece includes an introduction and a concluding statement, but the reasons to support the opinion are vague and unsupported with evidence or clear examples. This omission could be due to a lack of understanding of the text and/or the idea that an opinion needs to be supported by clear reasons and evidence. Instead of supplying reasons to support their opinion, the writer vaguely restates parts of the focusing question.

This writer would benefit from multiple opportunities to orally discuss the text, the focus, and reasons that support their opinion before writing.

Provides well-elaborated evidence and **reasons that support the opinion**

Uses precise language and domain-specific vocabulary

The writer consistently uses linking words to connect opinion and reasons

Provides a concluding statement that relates to the opinion presented

Final Thoughts (Gr 2 Opinion: Exceeds)

Overall, this second grade opinion piece meets all the criteria for proficient and exceeds the standard in some areas. The writer shows a solid understanding of the reasons not to help the ospreys in nature (nature can take care of itself and too much human interference can weaken an animal's natural instincts), a difficult side of the argument to present with clarity and understanding. The writer consistently sticks to the focus, uses information from the text, and draws on sources used in the classroom.

The writer uses precise and sophisticated language, domain-specific vocabulary, and an authoritative tone, enhancing the claim of the writer.
